319 GRANT UPDATE

Interest in Marshall County's 319 Grant continues to grow as demand for the cost-share program has risen steadily over the past few months. Many conservation projects have been installed or are in the planning and engineering phases. Money is getting tight, but there may still be funds for additional projects. These projects include cover crops, stream bank stabilization, lakeshore erosion control, filter strips, native plantings, and equipment modifications for agricultural precision nutrient applications and conservation tillage. In addition, several free outreach and educational opportunities are being planned. The first is scheduled for April 27th and will be discussing landscaping with native plants. (see *Upcoming Events* on the front page). Other events in the planning phase include the following topics: Agricultural nutrient management, rain barrels and raingardens, and cover crops.
